- And the cloud departed from off the tabernacle; and, behold, Miriam *became* leprous, *white* as snow: and Aaron looked upon Miriam, and, behold, *she was* leprous.
- 11 And Aaron said unto Moses, Alas, my lord, I beseech thee, lay not the sin upon us, wherein we have done foolishly, and wherein we have sinned.
- 13 And Moses cried unto the LORD, saying, Heal her now, O God, I beseech thee.
- 15 And Miriam was shut out from the camp seven days: and the people journeyed not till Miriam was brought in *again*.
