- The Bible

1. Prov 20:12

12 The hearing ear, and the seeing eye, the LORD hath made even both of them.

2. Prov 29:18 (to :)

18 Where *there is* no vision, the people perish:

3. Ps 121:1, 2

- $_1$ I WILL lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help.
- 2 My help *cometh* from the LORD, which made heaven and earth.

4. Ps 146:8 (to 1st :)

8 The LORD openeth *the eyes of* the blind:

5. Isa 11:1, 3, 5

- ¹ AND there shall come forth a rod out of the stem of Jesse, and a Branch shall grow out of his roots:
- ³ And shall make him of quick understanding in the fear of the LORD: and he shall not judge after the sight of his eyes, neither reprove after the hearing of his ears:
- 5 And righteousness shall be the girdle of his loins, and faithfulness the girdle of his reins.

- ³ And in the morning, *It will be* foul weather to-day: for the sky is red and lowering. O *ye* hypocrites, ye can discern the face of the sky; but can ye not *discern* the signs of the times?

- ⁴² Either how canst thou say to thy brother, Brother, let me pull out the mote that is in thine eye, when thou thyself beholdest not the beam that is in thine own eye? Thou hypocrite, cast out first the beam out of thine own eye, and then shalt thou see clearly to pull out the mote that is in thy brother's eye.

- 6 And blessed is *he*, whosoever shall not be offended in me.

- ²² ¶ And he cometh to Bethsaida; and they bring a blind man unto him, and besought him to touch him.
- 23 And he took the blind man by the hand, and led him out of the town; and when he had spit on his eyes, and put his hands upon him, he asked him if he saw aught.
- 24 And he looked up, and said, I see men as trees, walking.
- 25 After that he put *his* hands again upon his eyes, and made him look up: and he was restored, and saw every man clearly.

15. Matt 6:22, 23

- 22 The light of the body is the eye: if therefore thine eye be single, thy whole body shall be full of light.
- 23 But if thine eye be evil, thy whole body shall be full of darkness. If therefore the light that is in thee be darkness, how great *is* that darkness!

16. Matt 5:29 if

29 if thy right eye offend thee, pluck it out, and cast *it* from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not *that* thy whole body should be cast into hell.

- ¹ THEN Agrippa said unto Paul, Thou art permitted to speak for thyself. Then Paul stretched forth the hand, and answered for himself:
- 4 My manner of life from my youth, which was at the first among mine own nation at Jerusalem, know all the Jews;
- ⁵ Which knew me from the beginning, if they would testify, that after the most straitest sect of our religion I lived a Pharisee.
- ⁹ I verily thought with myself, that I ought to do many things contrary to the name of Jesus of Nazareth.
- 10 Which thing I also did in Jerusalem: and many of the saints did I shut up in prison, having received authority from the chief priests; and when they were put to death, I gave my voice against *them*.
- 11 And I punished them oft in every synagogue, and compelled *them* to blaspheme; and being exceedingly mad against them, I persecuted *them* even unto strange cities.
- ¹² Whereupon as I went to Damascus with authority and commission from the chief priests,
- 13 At midday, O king, I saw in the way a light from heaven, above the brightness of the sun, shining round about me and them which journeyed with me.
- 14 And when we were all fallen to the earth, I heard a voice speaking unto me, and saying in the Hebrew tongue, Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me? *it is* hard for thee to kick against the pricks.
- 15 And I said, Who art thou, Lord? And he said, I am Jesus whom thou persecutest.

- But rise, and stand upon thy feet: for I have appeared unto thee for this purpose, to make thee a minister and a witness both of these things which thou hast seen, and of those things in the which I will appear unto thee;
- 17 Delivering thee from the people, and *from* the Gentiles, unto whom now I send thee,
- ¹⁸ To open their eyes, *and* to turn *them* from darkness to light, and *from* the power of Satan unto God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins, and inheritance among them which are sanctified by faith that is in me.
- 19 Whereupon, O king Agrippa, I was not disobedient unto the heavenly vision:
- 20 But shewed first unto them of Damascus, and at Jerusalem, and throughout all the coasts of Judæa, and *then* to the Gentiles, that they should repent and turn to God, and do works meet for repentance.

19. I John 2:10, 11

- 10 He that loveth his brother abideth in the light, and there is none occasion of stumbling in him.
- 11 But he that hateth his brother is in darkness, and walketh in darkness, and knoweth not whither he goeth, because that darkness hath blinded his eyes.

20. I Pet. 1:22

22 Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, *see that ye* love one another with a pure heart fervently:

21. Matt 5:14-16

- 14 Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid.
- 15 Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house.

5. S&H 324:19

Paul was not at first a disciple of Jesus but a persecutor of Jesus' followers. When the truth first appeared

- to him in Science, Paul was made blind, and his blindness was felt; but spiritual light soon enabled him to follow the example and teach-
- 24 ings of Jesus, healing the sick and preaching Christianity throughout Asia Minor, Greece, and even in imperial Rome.

6. S&H 83:9

Nothing is more antagonistic to Christian Science than a blind belief without understanding, for such a belief hides Truth and builds on error.

7. S&H 132:20

To-day, as of yore, unconscious of the

- 21 reappearing of the spiritual idea, blind belief shuts the door upon it, and condemns the cure of the sick and sinning if it is wrought on any but a material and a doctrinal
- 24 theory. Anticipating this rejection of idealism, of the true idea of God, — this salvation from all error, physical and mental, — Jesus asked, "When the Son of man
- cometh, shall he find faith on the earth?"

tudes. Whatever is governed by God, is never for an instant deprived of the light and might of intelligence and Life.

If we rise no higher

Paul's enlightenment than blind faith, the Science of healing is not attained, and Soul-existence, in the place of sense-existence, is not com-

6 prehended. We apprehend Life in divine Science only as we live above corporeal sense and correct it.

- 18 sign material, how much more should ye discern the sign mental, and compass the destruction of sin and sickness by overcoming the thoughts
- 21 which produce them, and by understanding the spiritual idea which corrects and destroys them.

24 If it is true that nerves have sensation, that matter has

intelligence, that the material organism causes the eyes to see and the ears to hear, then, when the body

Sight, hearing, all the spiritual senses of man, are
