Scriptural Selection

1. John 1:6–10, 12–14

- ⁶ ¶ There was a man sent from God, whose name *was* John.
- ⁷ The same came for a witness, to bear witness of the Light, that all *men* through him might believe.
- ⁸ He was not that Light, but *was sent* to bear witness of that Light.
- ⁹ *That* was the true Light, which lighteth every man that cometh into the world.
- ¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not.
- ¹² But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, *even* to them that believe on his name:
- ¹³ Which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.
- ¹⁴ And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.

2. John 8:12 (to Jesus), 12 saying

- 12 ¶ Then spake Jesus
- ¹² ...saying, I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life.

3. Matt. 24:13 he, 14 (to ;)

- 13 ...he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved.
- 14 And this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations;

4. Matt. 5:14 (to .), 16

- ¹⁴ Ye are the light of the world.
- ¹⁶ Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.
