The Bible

1. Ps. 23:1, 2

- 1 THE LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.
- He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters.

- The infinite Truth of the Christ-cure has come to this age through a "still, small voice," through silent utterances and divine anointing which quicken and increase
- the beneficial effects of Christianity. I long to see the consummation of my hope, namely, the student's higher attainments in this line of light.

8. SH 40:31

The nature of Christianity is peaceful and blessed, but in order to enter into the kingdom, the anchor of

- 41:1 hope must be cast beyond the veil of matter into the Shekinah into which Jesus has passed before us; and
- this advance beyond matter must come through the joys and triumphs of the righteous as well as through their sorrows and afflictions.
- 6 Like our Master, we must depart from material sense into the spiritual sense of being.

- through human warfare, not with bayonet and blood, but through Christ's divine Science.

God has built a higher platform of human rights, and
He has built it on diviner claims. These claims are not
made through code or creed, but in demonstration of "on earth peace, good-will toward men."
