The Bible

1. Ps. 19:8

8 The statutes of the LORD *are* right, rejoicing the heart: the commandment of the LORD *is* pure, enlightening the eyes.

2. Ps. 103:17 1st the, 18

- the mercy of the LORD *is* from everlasting to everlasting upon them that fear him, and his righteousness unto children's children;
- To such as keep his covenant, and to those that remember his commandments to do them.

3. Ps. 119:10, 35, 36, 66

- 10 With my whole heart have I sought thee: O let me not wander from thy commandments.
- 35 Make me to go in the path of thy commandments; for therein do I delight.
- 36 Incline my heart unto thy testimonies, and not to covetousness.
- Teach me good judgment and knowledge: for I have believed thy commandments.

4. Ps. 112:1-5

- PRAISE ye the LORD. Blessed *is* the man *that* feareth the LORD, *that* delighteth greatly in his commandments.
- 2 His seed shall be mighty upon earth: the generation of the upright shall be blessed.
- Wealth and riches *shall be* in his house: and his righteousness endureth for ever.
- 4 Unto the upright there ariseth light in the darkness: *he is* gracious, and full of compassion, and righteous.
- 5 A good man sheweth favour, and lendeth: he will guide his affairs with discretion.

5. Deut. 5:1-5 Moses (to ;)

- Moses called all Israel, and said unto them, Hear, O Israel, the statutes and judgments which I speak in your ears this day, that ye may learn them, and keep, and do them.
- 2 The LORD our God made a covenant with us in Horeb.
- The LORD made not this covenant with our fathers, but with us, *even* us, who *are* all of us here alive this day.

- The LORD talked with you face to face in the mount out of the midst of the fire,
- 5 (I stood between the LORD and you at that time, to shew you the word of the LORD: for ye were afraid by reason of the fire, and went not up into the mount;)

6. Ex. 20:1-5 (to :), 7-20

- 1 AND God spake all these words, saying,
- 2 I am the LORD thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage.
- 3 Thou shalt have no other gods before me.
- 4 Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image, or any likeness *of any thing* that *is* in heaven above, or that *is* in the earth beneath, or that *is* in the water under the earth:
- 5 Thou shalt not bow down thyself to them, nor serve them:
- 7 Thou shalt not take the name of the LORD thy God in vain; for the LORD will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain.
- 8 Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy.
- 9 Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work:
- 10 But the seventh day *is* the sabbath of the LORD thy God: *in it* thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that *is* within thy gates:
- 11 For *in* six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them *is*, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day, and hallowed it.
- ¶ Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee.
- 13 Thou shalt not kill.
- 14 Thou shalt not commit adultery.
- 15 Thou shalt not steal.
- 16 Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbour.
- 17 Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's house, thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor any thing that *is* thy neighbour's.
- ¶ And all the people saw the thunderings, and the lightnings, and the noise of the trumpet, and the mountain smoking: and when the people saw *it*, they removed, and stood afar off.
- And they said unto Moses, Speak thou with us, and we will hear: but let not God speak with us, lest we die.
- And Moses said unto the people, Fear not: for God is come to prove you, and that his fear may be before your faces, that ye sin not.

7. Deut. 30:9-11 1st the, 14

- 9 the LORD thy God will make thee plenteous in every work of thine hand, in the fruit of thy body, and in the fruit of thy cattle, and in the fruit of thy land, for good: for the LORD will again rejoice over thee for good, as he rejoiced over thy fathers:
- If thou shalt hearken unto the voice of the LORD thy God, to keep his commandments and his statutes which are written in this book of the law, and if thou turn unto the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul.
- ¶ For this commandment which I command thee this day, it *is* not hidden from thee, neither *is* it far off.
- But the word *is* very nigh unto thee, in thy mouth, and in thy heart, that thou mayest do it.

8. Luke 8:40 when

when Jesus was returned, the people *gladly* received him: for they were all waiting for him.

9. Luke 14:1-4

- 1 AND it came to pass, as he went into the house of one of the chief Pharisees to eat bread on the sabbath day, that they watched him.
- And, behold, there was a certain man before him which had the dropsy.
- 3 And Jesus answering spake unto the lawyers and Pharisees, saying, Is it lawful to heal on the sabbath day?
- 4 And they held their peace. And he took *him*, and healed him, and let him go;

10. Matt 22:34-40 when

- when the Pharisees had heard that he had put the Sadducees to silence, they were gathered together.
- Then one of them, *which was* a lawyer, asked *him a question*, tempting him, and saying,
- 36 Master, which is the great commandment in the law?
- Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind.
- 38 This is the first and great commandment.
- 39 And the second *is* like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.
- 40 On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.

11. John 13:34, 35

A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.

By this shall all *men* know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.

12. I John 5:3 this (to:)

3 this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments:

13. Eccl. 12:13

¶ Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this *is* the whole *duty* of man.

Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures by Mary Baker Eddy

1. SH 340:15-22

"Thou shalt have no other gods before me." (Exodus xx. 3.) The First Commandment is my favorite text.
It demonstrates Christian Science. It inculcates the triunity of God, Spirit, Mind; it signifies that man shall have no other spirit or mind but God, eternal good, and that all men shall have one Mind. The divine Principle

of the First Commandment bases the Science of being, by which man demonstrates health, holiness, and life eternal.

2. SH 19:29-3

Jesus urged the commandment, "Thou shalt have no
other gods before me," which may be rendered: Thou shalt have no belief of Life as
mortal; thou shalt not know evil, for there is one Life, —
20:1 even God, good. He rendered "unto Cæsar the things
which are Cæsar's; and unto God the things that are
God's."

3. SH 280:17-30

Moses declared as Jehovah's

- first command of the Ten: "Thou shalt have no other gods before me!" But behold the zeal of belief to establish the opposite error of many
- minds. The argument of the serpent in the allegory, "Ye shall be as gods," urges through every avenue the belief that Soul is in body, and that infinite Spirit, and Life, is
- 24 in finite forms.

Rightly understood, instead of possessing a sentient material form, man has a sensationless body; and God,

the Soul of man and of all existence, being perpetual in His own individuality, harmony, and immortality, imparts and perpetuates these qualities

in man, — through Mind, not matter.

4. SH 301:20-24, 32

The belief that man has any other

- substance, or mind, is not spiritual and breaks the First Commandment, Thou shalt have one God, one Mind. Mortal man seems to himself to be material sub-
- stance, while man is "image" (idea).
- Immortality is not bounded by mortality.
- 302:1 Soul is not compassed by finiteness. Principle is not to be found in fragmentary ideas.

5. SH 69:19

Some

day the child will ask his parent: "Do you keep the First

- Commandment? Do you have one God and creator, or is man a creator?" If the father replies, "God creates man through man," the child may ask, "Do you teach
- that Spirit creates materially, or do you declare that Spirit is infinite, therefore matter is out of the question?" Jesus said, "The children of this world marry,
- and are given in marriage: But they which shall be accounted worthy to obtain that world, and the resurrection from the dead, neither marry, nor are given in
- 30 marriage."

6. SH 56:7-8, 15

Marriage is the legal and moral provision for generation among human kind.

- Infidelity to the marriage covenant is the social scourge of all races, "the pestilence that walketh in darkness, . . . the destruction that wasteth at noonday."
- The commandment, "Thou shalt not commit adultery," is no less imperative than the one, "Thou

shalt not kill."

Revelation xii. 3. And there appeared another wonder in
 heaven; and behold a great red dragon, having seven heads and ten horns, and seven crowns upon his heads.

- Human sense may well marvel at discord, while, to a diviner sense, harmony is the real and discord the unreal.
- We may well be astonished at sin, sickness, and death. We may well be perplexed at human fear; and still more astounded at hatred, which lifts
- its hydra head, showing its horns in the many inventions of evil. But why should we stand aghast at nothingness?

 The great red dragon symbolizes a lie, the belief
- that substance, life, and intelligence can be material.

This dragon stands for the sum total of human error. The ten horns of the dragon typify the belief that matter has power of its own, and that by means of an evil mind in matter the Ten Commandments can be

broken.

The evidence of the physical senses often reverses the real Science of being, and so creates a reign of discord, —

- assigning seeming power to sin, sickness, and death; but the great facts of Life, rightly understood, defeat this triad of errors, contradict their false
- 6 witnesses, and reveal the kingdom of heaven, the actual reign of harmony on earth.

9. SH 112:16-6

From the infinite One in Christian Science comes one Principle and its infinite idea, and with this infinitude

- come spiritual rules, laws, and their demonstration, which, like the great Giver, are "the same yesterday, and to-day, and forever;" for thus are
- the divine Principle of healing and the Christ-idea characterized in the epistle to the Hebrews.

Any theory of Christian Science, which departs from what has already been stated and proved to be true, affords no foundation upon which to establish a genuine school of this Science. Also, if any

- so-called new school claims to be Christian Science, and yet uses another author's discoveries without giving that author proper credit, such a school is erroneous, for it
- inculcates a breach of that divine commandment in the Hebrew Decalogue, "Thou shalt not steal."

God is the Principle of divine metaphysics. As there
113:1 is but one God, there can be but one divine Principle of
all Science; and there must be fixed rules for the demon-

- stration of this divine Principle. The letter of Science plentifully reaches humanity to-day, but its spirit comes only in small degrees. The vital part,
- the heart and soul of Christian Science, is Love.

10. SH 25:13-16, 19

Jesus taught the way of Life by demonstration, that we may understand how this divine Principle heals testimony

11. SH 20:6

- To the ritualistic priest and hypocritical Pharisee Jesus said, "The publicans and the harlots go into the kingdom of God before you." Jesus' history made a
- 9 new calendar, which we call the Christian era; but he established no ritualistic worship. He knew that men can be baptized, partake of the Eucharist, support the
- clergy, observe the Sabbath, make long prayers, and yet be sensual and sinful.

12. SH 31:4

Jesus acknowledged no ties of the flesh. He said: "Call no man your father upon the earth: for one is your Father,

- which is in heaven." Again he asked: "Who is my mother, and who are my brethren," implying that it is they who do the will of his Father. We
- have no record of his calling any man by the name of *father*: He recognized Spirit, God, as the only creator, and therefore as the Father of all.

13. SH 4:5-9

- 3 To keep the com-
- 6 mandments of our Master and follow his example, is our proper debt to him and the only worthy evidence of our gratitude for all that he has
- 9 done.

14. SH 241:19-24

The substance of all devotion is the reflection and demonstration of divine Love, healing sickness and

- destroying sin. Our Master said, "If ye love me, keep my commandments."
- One's aim, a point beyond faith, should be to find the footsteps of Truth, the way to health and holiness.

15. SH 340:4

This text in the book of Ecclesiastes conveys the Christian Science thought, especially when the word

- duty, which is not in the original, is omitted: "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep His commandments: for this is the whole
- 9 duty of man." In other words: Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: love God and keep His

Fleshly ties temporal commandments: for this is the whole of man in His image and likeness. Divine Love is infinite. Therefore all that really exists is in and of God, and manifests His love.
