The Bible

1. Prov. 3:25, 26

- 25 Be not afraid of sudden fear, neither of the desolation of the wicked, when it cometh.
- 26 For the LORD shall be thy confidence, and shall keep thy foot from being taken.

2. Prov. 29:25

25 The fear of man bringeth a snare: but whoso putteth his trust in the LORD shall be safe.

3. Job 22:10 snares, 12, 29 There

- snares are round about thee, and sudden fear troubleth thee;
- 12 Is not God in the height of heaven? and behold the height of the stars, how high they are!
- 29 There is lifting up; and he shall save the humble person.

4. I Kings 19:1 Ahab, 2, 9-12 1st he

- Ahab told Jezebel all that Elijah had done, and withal how he had slain all the prophets with the sword.
- Then Jezebel sent a messenger unto Elijah, saying, So let the gods do *to me*, and more also, if I make not thy life as the life of one of them by tomorrow about this time.
- 9 he came thither unto a cave, and lodged there; and, behold, the word of the LORD *came* to him, and he said unto him, What doest thou here, Elijah?
- And he said, I have been very jealous for the LORD God of hosts: for the children of Israel have forsaken thy covenant, thrown down thine altars, and slain thy prophets with the sword; and I, *even* I only, am left; and they seek my life, to take it away.
- And he said, Go forth, and stand upon the mount before the LORD. And, behold, the LORD passed by, and a great and strong wind rent the mountains, and brake in pieces the rocks before the LORD; but the LORD was not in the wind: and after the wind an earthquake; but the LORD was not in the earthquake:
- 12 And after the earthquake a fire; *but* the LORD *was* not in the fire: and after the fire a still small voice.

- A thousand shall fall at thy side, and ten thousand at thy right hand; *but* it shall not come nigh thee.
- 10 There shall no evil befall thee, neither shall any plague come night hy dwelling.

¶ And they were in the way going up to Jerusalem; and Jesus went before them: and they were amazed; and as they followed, they were afraid.

7. Luke 21:5-8 (to :), 9-11 when, 20-22, 25-28, 33, 36

- ⁵ ¶ And as some spake of the temple, how it was adorned with goodly stones and gifts, he said,
- 6 As for these things which ye behold, the days will come, in the which there shall not be left one stone upon another, that shall not be thrown down.
- And they asked him, saying, Master, but when shall these things be? and what sign *will there be* when these things shall come to pass?
- 8 And he said, Take heed that ye be not deceived:
- 9 when ye shall hear of wars and commotions, be not terrified: for these things must first come to pass; but the end *is* not by and by.
- 10 Then said he unto them, Nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom:
- And great earthquakes shall be in divers places, and famines, and pestilences; and fearful sights and great signs shall there be from heaven.
- 20 And when ye shall see Jerusalem compassed with armies, then know that the desolation thereof is nigh.
- 21 Then let them which are in Judæa flee to the mountains; and let them which are in the midst of it depart out; and let not them that are in the countries enter thereinto.
- 22 For these be the days of vengeance, that all things which are written may be fulfilled.
- ¶ And there shall be signs in the sun, and in the moon, and in the stars; and upon the earth distress of nations, with perplexity; the sea and the waves roaring;
- Men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth: for the powers of heaven shall be shaken.
- And then shall they see the Son of man coming in a cloud with power and great glory.
- And when these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh.
- Heaven and earth shall pass away: but my words shall not pass away.

Watch ye therefore, and pray always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man.

- 3 What time I am afraid, I will trust in thee.
- In God have I put my trust: I will not be afraid what man can do unto me.

9. Ps. 3:6

6 I will not be afraid of ten thousands of people, that have set *themselves* against me round about.

10. Acts 9:22-31 Saul

- 22 Saul increased the more in strength, and confounded the Jews which dwelt at Damascus, proving that this is very Christ.
- ¶ And after that many days were fulfilled, the Jews took counsel to kill him:
- 24 But their laying await was known of Saul. And they watched the gates day and night to kill him.
- Then the disciples took him by night, and let *him* down by the wall in a basket.
- And when Saul was come to Jerusalem, he assayed to join himself to the disciples: but they were all afraid of him, and believed not that he was a disciple.
- 27 But Barnabas took him, and brought *him* to the apostles, and declared unto them how he had seen the Lord in the way, and that he had spoken to him, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus.
- 28 And he was with them coming in and going out at Jerusalem.
- And he spake boldly in the name of the Lord Jesus, and disputed against the Grecians: but they went about to slay him.
- 30 *Which* when the brethren knew, they brought him down to Cæsarea, and sent him forth to Tarsus.
- Then had the churches rest throughout all Judæa and Galilee and Samaria, and were edified; and walking in the fear of the Lord, and in the comfort of the Holy Ghost, were multiplied.

11. I Pet. 3:13 who

who is he that will harm you, if ye be followers of that which is good?

12. Ps. 112:4, 7

- 4 Unto the upright there ariseth light in the darkness: *he is* gracious, and full of compassion, and righteous.
- 7 He shall not be afraid of evil tidings: his heart is fixed, trusting in the LORD.

13. I John 4:1, 7, 18 1st perfect (to:)

- BELOVED, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world.
- Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God.

We should master fear, instead of cultivating it. It was the ignorance of our forefathers in the departments of knowledge now broadcast in the earth, that made them hardier than our trained physiologists, more honest than our sleek politicians.

7. SH 406:16-25

The moral

man has no fear that he will commit a murder, and he

should be as fearless on the question of disease.

Resist evil — error of every sort — and it will flee from you. Error is opposed to Life. We can, and ultimately

- shall, so rise as to avail ourselves in every direction of the supremacy of Truth over error, Life over death, and good over evil, and this growth will go
- on until we arrive at the fulness of God's idea, and no

more fear that we shall be sick and die.

8. SH 392:7

Casting out evil and fear enables truth to outweigh error. The only course is to

take antagonistic grounds against all that is opposed to the health, holiness, and harmony of man, God's image.

- As mortals do not comprehend even mortal existence, how ignorant must they be of the all-knowing Mind and of His creations.
- 6 Here you may see how so-called material sense creates its own forms of thought, gives them material names, and then worships and fears them. The beliefs of the human mind rob and enslave it, and then impute this result to another illusive
- 12 personification, named Satan.

10. SH 411:24 (only), 27-29

- 24 The mental state is called a material state.
- 27 Always begin your treatment by allaying the fear of patients. Silently reassure them as to their exemption from disease and danger.

11. SH 417:27-2

- Explain audibly to your patients, as soon as they can bear it, the complete control which Mind holds over the body. Show them how mortal mind seems to induce
- 30 disease by certain fears and false conclusions, and how divine Mind can cure by opposite thoughts. Give your patients an underlying understanding to support them
- 418:1 and to shield them from the baneful effects of their own conclusions.

12. SH 419:28-30

To succeed in healing, you must conquer your own fears as well as those of your patients, and rise into higher and holier consciousness.

6 its hydra head, showing its horns in the many inventions of evil. But why should we stand aghast at nothingness?

The physical effects of fear illustrate its illusion. Gazing at a chained lion, crouched for a spring, should not terrify a man. Nothing but the power of Truth can prevent the fear of

21 error, and prove man's dominion over error.

18. SH 559:8-16

The "still, small voice"

- of scientific thought reaches over continent and ocean to the globe's remotest bound. The inaudible voice of Truth is, to the human mind, "as when a lion roareth."
- 12 It is heard in the desert and in dark places of fear. It arouses the "seven thunders" of evil, and stirs their latent forces to utter the full diapason of secret tones. Then is
- the power of Truth demonstrated, made manifest in the destruction of error.

19. SH 381:8-10, 15-16

When infringing some supposed law, you say that there is danger. This fear is the danger and induces the physical effects. God is the lawmaker, but He is not the author of barbarous codes.

20. SH 22:14-17

If

your endeavors are beset by fearful odds, and you receive no present reward, go not back to error, nor become a sluggard in the race.

21. SH 442:25

St. Paul says, "Work out your own salvation with fear and trembling:" Jesus said, "Fear not, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom." This truth is Christian Science.

22. SH 125:12-16

12 As human thought changes from one stage to another of conscious pain and painlessness, sorrow and Benefits of metaphysics

No laws of matter

joy, - from fear to hope and from faith to understand-

ing, — the visible manifestation will at last be man governed by Soul, not by material sense.

23. SH 298:13-18

Spiritual sense, contradicting the material senses, involves intuition, hope, faith, understanding, fruition, real-

- ity. Material sense expresses the belief that mind is in matter. This human belief, alternating between a sense of pleasure and pain, hope and fear, life and death, never
- reaches beyond the boundary of the mortal or the unreal.
