## The Bible

1. Ps. 77:14 (to :)

14 Thou *art* the God that doest wonders:

2. Ps. 96:3

3 Declare his glory among the heathen, his wonders among all people.

3. Ps. 9:1

1 I WILL praise *thee*, O LORD, with my whole heart; I will shew forth all thy marvellous works.

4. I Chron. 16:12, 24

12 Remember his marvellous works that he hath done, his wonders, and the judgments of his mouth;

24 Declare his glory among the heathen; his marvellous works among all nations.

6. John 2:1-3 1st the, 7-11 (to ;), 23

1 the third day there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee; and the mother of Jesus was there:

3 And when they wanted wine, the mother of Jesus saith unto him, They have no wine.

7 Jesus saith unto them, Fill the waterpots with water. And they filled them up to the brim.

8 And he saith unto them, Draw out now, and bear unto the governor of the feast. And they bare *it*.

9 When the ruler of the feast had tasted the water that was made wine, and knew not whence it was: (but the servants which drew the water knew;) the governor of the feast called the bridegroom,

10 And saith unto him, Every man at the beginning doth set forth good wine; and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: *but* thou hast kept the good wine until now.

11 This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee, and manifested forth his glory;

23 ¶ Now when he was in Jerusalem at the passover, in the feast *day*, many believed in his name, when they saw the miracles which he did.

7. John 4:46, 50 (to 1st .), 54

46 So Jesus came again into Cana of Galilee, where he made the water wine. And there was a certain nobleman, whose son was sick at Capernaum.

50 Jesus saith unto him, Go thy way; thy son liveth.

54 This *is* again the second miracle *that* Jesus did, when he was come out of Judæa into Galilee.

8. John 3:1, 2

1 THERE was a man of the Pharisees, named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews:

2 The same came to Jesus by night, and said unto him, Rabbi, we know that thou art a teacher come from God: for no man can do these miracles that thou doest, except God be with him.

9. John 6:2, 5, 10-12, 14

2 And a great multitude followed him, because they saw his miracles which he did on them that were diseased.

5 ¶ When Jesus then lifted up *his* eyes, and saw a great company come unto him, he saith unto Philip, Whence shall we buy bread, that these may eat?

10 And Jesus said, Make the men sit down. Now there was much grass in the place. So the men sat down, in number about five thousand.

11 And Jesus took the loaves; and when he had given thanks, he distributed to the disciples, and the disciples to them that were set down; and likewise of the fishes as much as they would.

12 When they were filled, he said unto his disciples, Gather up the fragments that remain, that nothing be lost.

14 Then those men, when they had seen the miracle that Jesus did, said, This is of a truth that prophet that should come into the world.

10. John 7:31

31 And many of the people believed on him, and said, When Christ cometh, will he do more miracles than these which this *man* hath done?

11. Matt. 19:26 Jesus

26 Jesus beheld *them*, and said unto them, With men this is impossible; but with God all things are possible.

12. Job 5:8, 9

8 I would seek unto God, and unto God would I commit my cause:

- 9 Which doeth great things and unsearchable; marvellous things without number:

13. Acts 2:22-24

- 22 Ye men of Israel, hear these words; Jesus of Nazareth, a man approved of God among you by miracles and wonders and signs, which God did by him in the midst of you, as ye yourselves also know:
- 23 Him, being delivered by the determinate counsel and foreknowledge of God, ye have taken, and by wicked hands have crucified and slain:
- 24 Whom God hath raised up, having loosed the pains of death: because it was not possible that he should be holden of it.

14. Acts 6:7, 8

- 7 And the word of God increased; and the number of the disciples multiplied in Jerusalem greatly; and a great company of the priests were obedient to the faith.
- 8 And Stephen, full of faith and power, did great wonders and miracles among the people.

15. Acts 8:12 when, 13

- 12 when they believed Philip preaching the things concerning the kingdom of God, and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized, both men and women.
- 13 Then Simon himself believed also: and when he was baptized, he continued with Philip, and wondered, beholding the miracles and signs which were done.

16. Acts 19:11, 12

- 11 And God wrought special miracles by the hands of Paul:
- 12 So that from his body were brought unto the sick handkerchiefs or aprons, and the diseases departed from them, and the evil spirits went out of them.

17. I Cor. 12:7 1st the, 8, 10 (to 1st ;)

- 7 the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal.
- 8 For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit;

**Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures by Mary Baker Eddy**

1. SH 591:21-22

21 **MIRACLE.** That which is divinely natural, but must  
be learned humanly; a phenomenon of Science.

2. SH 134:31-32

A miracle fulfils God's law, but does not violate that  
law.

3. SH 135:6-8

The miracle  
introduces no disorder, but unfolds the primal order,  
establishing the Science of God's unchangeable law.

4. SH 131:26

The mission of Jesus confirmed prophecy, and ex-  
27 plained the so-called miracles of olden time as natural  
demonstrations of the divine power, demonstra-  
tions which were not understood. Jesus' works  
30 established his claim to the Messiahship. In  
reply to John's inquiry, "Art thou he that should come,"  
132:1 Jesus returned an affirmative reply, recounting his works  
instead of referring to his doctrine, confident that this  
3 exhibition of the divine power to heal would fully an-  
swer the question. Hence his reply: "Go and show  
John again those things which ye do hear and see: the  
6 blind receive their sight and the lame walk, the lepers  
are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up,  
and the poor have the gospel preached to them. And  
9 blessed is he, whosoever shall not be offended in me." In  
other words, he gave his benediction to any one who  
should not deny that such effects, coming from divine  
12 Mind, prove the unity of God, — the divine Principle  
which brings out all harmony.

5. SH 138:9-11

On this spiritually scientific basis  
Jesus explained his cures, which appeared miraculous to  
outsiders.

6. SH 539:27-1

27 The divine origin of Jesus gave him more than human  
power to expound the facts of creation, and demonstrate  
the one Mind which makes and governs man  
30 and the universe. The Science of creation,  
so conspicuous in the birth of Jesus, inspired his wisest  
and least-understood sayings, and was the basis of his  
540:1 marvellous demonstrations.

7. SH 270:31-1

The life of Christ Jesus was not miraculous, but it was indigenous to his spirituality, — the good soil wherein the seed of Truth springs up and bears much fruit.

#### 8. SH 343:15-20

By parable and argument he explains the impossibility of good producing evil; and he also scientifically demonstrates this great fact, proving by what are wrongly called miracles, that sin, sickness, and death are beliefs — illusive errors — which he could and did destroy.

#### 9. SH 563:1-7 (to ?)

Human sense may well marvel at discord, while, to a diviner sense, harmony is the real and discord the unreal. We may well be astonished at sin, sickness, and death. We may well be perplexed at human fear; and still more astounded at hatred, which lifts its hydra head, showing its horns in the many inventions of evil. But why should we stand aghast at nothingness?

#### 10. SH 347:3-6

It is said by one critic, that to verify this wonderful philosophy Christian Science declares that whatever is mortal or discordant has no origin, existence, nor realness.

#### 11. SH 133:13-18

In national prosperity, miracles attended the successes of the Hebrews; but when they departed from the true idea, their demoralization began. Even in captivity among foreign nations, the divine Principle wrought wonders for the people of God in the fiery furnace and in kings' palaces.

#### 12. SH 134:14-17

Man-made doctrines are waning. They have not waxed strong in times of trouble. Devoid of the Christ-power, how can they illustrate the doctrines of Christ or the miracles of grace?

#### 13. SH 117:19-28

Human theories are inadequate to interpret the divine Principle involved in the miracles (marvels) wrought by Jesus and especially in his mighty, crowning, unparalleled, and triumphant exit from the flesh.

Evidence drawn from the five physical senses relates

Opacity of the  
senses

solely to human reason; and because of opacity to the true light, human reason dimly reflects and feebly transmits Jesus' works and words. Truth is a revelation.

#### 14. SH 123:19-29

The revelation consists of two parts:

1. The discovery of this divine Science of Mind-healing, through a spiritual sense of the Scriptures and through the teachings of the Comforter, as promised by the Master.
2. The proof, by present demonstration, that the so-called miracles of Jesus did not specially belong to a dispensation now ended, but that they illustrated an ever-operative divine Principle. The operation of this Principle indicates the eternity of the scientific order and continuity of being.

#### 15. SH 135:11

The same power which heals sin heals also sickness.

- This is "the beauty of holiness," that when Truth heals the sick, it casts out evils, and when Truth casts out the evil called disease, it heals the sick. When Christ cast out the devil of dumbness, "it came to pass, when the devil was gone out, the dumb spake." There is to-day danger of repeating the offence of the Jews by limiting the Holy One of Israel and asking: "Can God furnish a table in the wilderness?" What cannot God do?

#### 16. SH 83:12-16

- Miracles are impossible in Science, and here Science takes issue with popular religions. The scientific manifestation of power is from the divine nature and is not supernatural, since Science is an explication of nature.

#### 17. SH 13:20-24

- If we pray to God as a corporeal person, this will prevent us from relinquishing the human doubts and fears which attend such a belief, and so we cannot grasp the wonders wrought by infinite, incorporeal Love, to whom all things are possible.

#### 18. SH 232:9-12

- Scripture informs us that "with God all things are possible," — all good is possible to Spirit; but our prevalent theories practically deny this, and make healing

12 possible only through matter.

19. SH 1:1-4

1:1 The prayer that reforms the sinner and heals the  
sick is an absolute faith that all things are  
3 possible to God, — a spiritual understanding of Him,  
an unselfed love.

20. SH 501:13-18

So-called  
mystery and miracle, which subserve the end of natural  
15 good, are explained by that Love for whose rest the  
weary ones sigh when needing something more native  
to their immortal cravings than the history of perpetual  
18 evil.

21. SH 474:11-15

Christian marvels (and *marvel* is the sim-  
12 ple meaning of the Greek word rendered *miracle* in the  
New Testament) will be misunderstood and misused  
by many, until the glorious Principle of these marvels is  
15 gained.

22. SH 560:11-15

The great  
12 miracle, to human sense, is divine Love, and  
the grand necessity of existence is to gain the  
true idea of what constitutes the kingdom of  
15 heaven in man.
