<u>The Bible</u>

- 1. Deut. 4:9 take (to :), 23, 31
 - 9 take heed to thyself, and keep thy soul diligently, lest thou forget the things which thine eyes have seen, and lest they depart from thy heart all the days of thy life:
- 23 Take heed unto yourselves, lest ye forget the covenant of the LORD your God, which he made with you, and make you a graven image, *or* the likeness of any *thing*, which the LORD thy God hath forbidden thee.
- 31 (For the LORD thy God *is* a merciful God;) he will not forsake thee, neither destroy thee, nor forget the covenant of thy fathers which he sware unto them.

2. Ps 25:6, 7

- ⁶ Remember, O LORD, thy tender mercies and thy loving kindnesses; for they *have been* ever of old.
- 7 Remember not the sins of my youth, nor my transgressions: according to thy mercy remember thou me for thy goodness' sake, O LORD.

- 4 Remember me, O LORD, with the favour *that thou bearest unto* thy people: O visit me with thy salvation;
- 7 Our fathers understood not thy wonders in Egypt; they remembered not the multitude of thy mercies; but provoked *him* at the sea, *even* at the Red sea.

4. Gen. 39:1 Joseph, 2, 7, 10, 11, 12, 14, 20, 21

- Joseph was brought down to Egypt; and Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh, captain of the guard, an Egyptian, bought him of the hands of the Ishmeelites, which had brought him down thither.
- 2 And the LORD was with Joseph, and he was a prosperous man; and he was in the house of his master the Egyptian.
- 7 ¶ And it came to pass after these things, that his master's wife cast her eyes upon Joseph; and she said, Lie with me.
- ¹⁰ And it came to pass, as she spake to Joseph day by day, that he hearkened not unto her, to lie by her, *or* to be with her.
- 11 And it came to pass about this time, that *Joseph* went into the house to do his business; and *there was* none of the men of the house there within.
- 12 And she caught him by his garment, saying, Lie with me: and he left his garment in her hand, and fled, and got him out.
- 14 That she called unto the men of her house, and spake unto them, saying, See, he hath brought in an Hebrew unto us to mock us; he came in unto me to lie with me, and I cried with a loud voice:

- 20 And Joseph's master took him, and put him into the prison, a place where the king's prisoners *were* bound: and he was there in the prison.
- 21 ¶ But the LORD was with Joseph, and shewed him mercy, and gave him favour in the sight of the keeper of the prison.

5. Gen 40:2, 3, 5, 9, 12 (to :), 13 within, 14, 20, 21, 23

- 2 And Pharaoh was wroth against two *of* his officers, against the chief of the butlers, and against the chief of the bakers.
- ³ And he put them in ward in the house of the captain of the guard, into the prison, the place where Joseph *was* bound.
- 5 ¶ And they dreamed a dream both of them, each man his dream in one night, each man according to the interpretation of his dream, the butler and the baker of the king of Egypt, which were bound in the prison.
- 9 And the chief butler told his dream to Joseph, and said to him, In my dream, behold, a vine *was* before me;
- 12 And Joseph said unto him, This is the interpretation of it:
- 13 within three days shall Pharaoh lift up thine head, and restore thee unto thy place: and thou shalt deliver Pharaoh's cup into his hand, after the former manner when thou wast his butler.
- ¹⁴ But think on me when it shall be well with thee, and shew kindness, I pray thee, unto me, and make mention of me unto Pharaoh, and bring me out of this house:
- 20 ¶ And it came to pass the third day, which was Pharaoh's birthday, that he made a feast unto all his servants: and he lifted up the head of the chief butler and of the chief baker among his servants.
- 21 And he restored the chief butler unto his butlership again; and he gave the cup into Pharaoh's hand:
- 23 Yet did not the chief butler remember Joseph, but forgat him.

6. II Kings 17:38 the (to ;)

38 the covenant that I have made with you ye shall not forget;

7. Deut 32:7

7 ¶ Remember the days of old, consider the years of many generations: ask thy father, and he will shew thee; thy elders, and they will tell thee.

8. Jude 1:17 beloved

¹⁷ beloved, remember ye the words which were spoken before of the apostles of our Lord Jesus Christ;

9. Prov. 4:5 (to ;)

5 Get wisdom, get understanding: forget *it* not;

10. Mark 8:14-18, 21 How (to 1st ?)

- 14 ¶ Now *the disciples* had forgotten to take bread, neither had they in the ship with them more than one loaf.
- 15 And he charged them, saying, Take heed, beware of the leaven of the Pharisees, and *of* the leaven of Herod.

And they reasoned among themselves, saying, It is because we have no

- 16 bread.
- 17 And when Jesus knew *it*, he saith unto them, Why reason ye, because ye have no bread? perceive ye not yet, neither understand? have ye your heart yet hardened?
- 18 Having eyes, see ye not? and having ears, hear ye not? and do ye not remember?

5 Remember ye not, that, when I was yet with you, I told you these things?

- ¹ THIS second epistle, beloved, I now write unto you; in *both* which I stir up your pure minds by way of remembrance:
- ² That ye may be mindful of the words which were spoken before by the holy prophets, and of the commandment of us the apostles of the Lord and Saviour:

13. Heb. 6:10

¹⁰ For God *is* not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love, which ye have shewed toward his name, in that ye have ministered to the saints, and do minister.

14. Heb. 10:16, 17

- 16 This *is* the covenant that I will make with them after those days, saith the Lord, I will put my laws into their hearts, and in their minds will I write them;

This spiritual meeting with our Lord in the dawn of a new light is the morning meal which Christian Scientists

6. SH 48:10

Remembering the sweat of agony which fell in holy benediction on the grass of Gethsemane, shall the hum-

- 12 blest or mightiest disciple murmur when he drinks from the same cup, and think, or even wish, to escape the exalting ordeal of sin's revenge on its destroyer? Truth and
- 15 Love bestow few palms until the consummation of a life-work.

7. SH 419:4-7

Your true course is

to destroy the foe, and leave the field to God, Life, Truth, and Love, remembering that God and His ideas alone are real and harmonious.

8. SH ix:26

- 18 you consult your brain in order to remember what has hurt you, when your remedy lies in forgetting
- 166:1 the whole thing; for matter has no sensation of its own, and the human mind is all that can produce pain.
- 3 As a man thinketh, so is he. Mind is all that feels, acts, or impedes action.

13. SH 372:1 (only)

372:1 Remember, brain is not mind.

14. SH 261:31-1

We should forget our bodies in remembering good and the human race. Good demands of man every hour, in 262:1 which to work out the problem of being.

15. SH 414:28

Remember that man's perfec-

tion is real and unimpeachable, whereas imperfection isblameworthy, unreal, and is not brought about by divine Love.

16. SH 385:11

Let us remember that the eternal law of right,

12 though it can never annul the law which makes sin its own executioner, exempts man from all penalties but those due for wrong-doing.

The depraved appetite for alcoholic drinks, tobacco, tea, coffee, opium, is destroyed only by Mind's mastery

- 411:1 Said Job: "The thing which I greatly feared is come upon me."
- ³ My first discovery in the student's practice was this: If the student silently called the disease by name, when he argued against it, as a general rule the body
- 6 would respond more quickly, just as a person replies more readily when his name is spoken; but this was because the student was not perfectly attuned to
- 9 divine Science, and needed the arguments of truth for reminders.

19. SH 34:5

If Christ,

- 6 Truth, has come to us in demonstration, no other commemoration is requisite, for demonstration is Immanuel, or *God with us;* and if a friend be with us, why need we
- 9 memorials of that friend?

20. SH 84:11-13

It is the prerogative of the ever-present, divine Mind, and

12 of thought which is in rapport with this Mind, to know the past, the present, and the future.

21. SH 394:28-29

We should remember that Life is God, and that God is omnipotent.
