1. Job 17:15 where (to 1st ?)

15 where *is* now my hope?

2. Heb. 11:1 faith (to ,)

1 faith is the substance of things hoped for,

3. Ps. 16:9 1st my, 10 (to ;)

9 my heart is glad, and my glory rejoiceth: my flesh also shall rest in hope.

10 For thou wilt not leave my soul in hell;

4. Ps. 31:24

24 Be of good courage, and he shall strengthen your heart, all ye that hope in the LORD.

7 Noah went in, and his sons, and his wife, and his sons' wives with him, into the ark, because of the waters of the flood.

8 Of clean beasts, and of beasts that *are* not clean, and of fowls, and of every thing that creepeth upon the earth,

8. Gen 8:1, 6-11

- AND God remembered Noah, and every living thing, and all the cattle that
 1 *was* with him in the ark: and God made a wind to pass over the earth, and
 the waters assuaged;
- 6 ¶ And it came to pass at the end of forty days, that Noah opened the
 window of the ark which he had made:
- 7 And he sent forth a raven, which went forth to and fro, until the waters
 were dried up from off the earth.
- 8 Also he sent forth a dove from him, to see if the waters were abated from
 off the face of the ground;
- 9 But the dove found no rest for the sole of her foot, and she returned unto
 him into the ark, for the waters *were* on the face of the whole earth: then
 he put forth his hand, and took her, and pulled her in unto him into the ark.
- 10 And he stayed yet other seven days; and again he sent forth the dove out
 of the ark;
- 11 And the dove came in to him in the evening; and, lo, in her mouth *was* an
 olive leaf plucked off: so Noah knew that the waters were abated from off
 the earth.

9. Joel 3:15-17

- 15 The sun and the moon shall be darkened, and the stars shall withdraw their
 shining.
- 16 The LORD also shall roar out of Zion, and utter his voice from Jerusalem;
 and the heavens and the earth shall shake: but the LORD *will be* the hope of
 his people, and the strength of the children of Israel.
- 17 So shall ye know that I *am* the LORD your God dwelling in Zion, my holy
 mountain: then shall Jerusalem be holy, and there shall no strangers pass
 through her any more.

10. Acts 27:1 when, 2 (to ;), 9, 10, 20-24 (to ;), 25, 40-44

- 1 when it was determined that we should sail into Italy, they delivered Paul
 and certain other prisoners unto *one* named Julius, a centurion of
 Augustus' band.
- 2 And entering into a ship of Adramyttium, we launched, meaning to sail by
 the coasts of Asia;
- 9 Now when much time was spent, and when sailing was now dangerous,
 because the fast was now already past, Paul admonished *them*,
- 10 And said unto them, Sirs, I perceive that this voyage will be with hurt and
 much damage, not only of the lading and ship, but also of our lives.
- 20 And when neither sun nor stars in many days appeared, and no small
 tempest lay on *us*, all hope that we should be saved was then taken away.
- 21 But after long abstinence Paul stood forth in the midst of them, and said,
 Sirs, ye should have hearkened unto me, and not have loosed from Crete,
 and to have gained this harm and loss.

- 22 And now I exhort you to be of good cheer: for there shall be no loss of *any man's* life among you, but of the ship.
- 23 For there stood by me this night the angel of God, whose I am, and whom I serve,
- 24 Saying, Fear not, Paul;
- 25 Wherefore, sirs, be of good cheer: for I believe God, that it shall be even as it was told me.
- 40 And when they had taken up the anchors, they committed *themselves* unto the sea, and loosed the rudder bands, and hoisted up the mainsail to the wind, and made toward shore.
- 41 And falling into a place where two seas met, they ran the ship aground; and the forepart stuck fast, and remained unmoveable, but the hinder part was broken with the violence of the waves.
- 42 And the soldiers' counsel was to kill the prisoners, lest any of them should swim out, and escape.
- 43 But the centurion, willing to save Paul, kept them from *their* purpose; and commanded that they which could swim should cast *themselves* first *into the sea*, and get to land:
- 44 And the rest, some on boards, and some on *broken pieces* of the ship. And so it came to pass, that they escaped all safe to land.

- 5 Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and *why* art thou disquieted in me? hope thou in God:

12. Jer. 17:7

- 7 Blessed *is* the man that trusteth in the LORD, and whose hope the LORD is.

13. Matt 20:17

- 17 ¶ And Jesus going up to Jerusalem took the twelve disciples apart in the way, and said unto them,

14. Matt. 18:11-14 the

- 11 the Son of man is come to save that which was lost.
- 12 How think ye? if a man have an hundred sheep, and one of them be gone astray, doth he not leave the ninety and nine, and goeth into the mountains, and seeketh that which is gone astray?
- 13 And if so be that he find it, verily I say unto you, he rejoiceth more of that *sheep*, than of the ninety and nine which went not astray.

- 1 being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:
- 3 And not only *so*, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience;
- 4 And patience, experience; and experience, hope:
- 5 And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.

16. Rom. 8:24, 25

- 24 For we are saved by hope: but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man seeth, why doth he yet hope for?
- 25 But if we hope for that we see not, *then* do we with patience wait for *it*.

17. Rom 15:13, 4

- 4 For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope.
- 13 Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that ye may abound in hope, through the power of the Holy Ghost.

14. SH 393:29

Man is never sick, for Mind is not sick and matter
 30 cannot be. A false belief is both the tempter
 and the tempted, the sin and the sinner, the
 disease and its cause. It is well to be calm in sickness;
 394:1 to be hopeful is still better; but to understand that sick-
 ness is not real and that Truth can destroy its seeming
 3 reality, is best of all, for this understanding is the uni-
 versal and perfect remedy.

Knowledge that we
 can accomplish the good we hope for, stimu-
 9 lates the system to act in the direction which Mind points
 out.

16. SH 108:30

30 My discovery, that erring, mortal, misnamed
mind produces all the organism and action of
 the mortal body, set my thoughts to work in new channels,
 109:1 and led up to my demonstration of the proposition that
 Mind is All and matter is naught as the leading factor in
 3 Mind-science.

17. SH 109:11-16

For three years after my discovery, I sought the solu-
 12 tion of this problem of Mind-healing, searched the Scrip-
 tures and read little else, kept aloof from so-
 ciety, and devoted time and energies to dis-
 15 covering a positive rule. The search was sweet, calm, and
 buoyant with hope, not selfish nor depressing.

 18 and sin reassures depressed hope.

19. SH 206:10

Will-power is capable of all evil. It can never heal
 the sick, for it is the prayer of the unrighteous; while
 12 the exercise of the sentiments — hope, faith, love — is the
 prayer of the righteous. This prayer, governed by Science
 instead of the senses, heals the sick.

20. SH 388:24-29

Because sin and sickness are not qualities of Soul, or Life, we have hope in immortality; but it would be foolish to venture beyond
 27 our present understanding, foolish to stop eating until we gain perfection and a clear comprehension of the living Spirit.

21. SH 531:8

It is well that the upper portions of the brain represent
 9 the higher moral sentiments, as if hope were ever prophesying thus: The human mind will sometime rise above all material and physical sense, ex-
 12 changing it for spiritual perception, and exchanging human concepts for the divine consciousness. Then man will recognize his God-given dominion and being.

12 Become conscious for a single moment that Life and intelligence are purely spiritual, — neither in nor of matter, — and the body will then utter no
 15 complaints. If suffering from a belief in sickness, you will find yourself suddenly well. Sorrow is turned into joy when the body is controlled by spir-
 18 itual Life, Truth, and Love. Hence the hope of the promise Jesus bestows: “He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; . . . because I
 21 go unto my Father,” — [because the Ego is absent from the body, and present with Truth and Love.]
