- 70:1 Mortal existence is an enigma. Every day is a mystery. The testimony of the corporeal senses
- cannot inform us what is real and what is delusive, but the revelations of Christian Science unlock the treasures of Truth. Whatever is false or sinful can
- 6 never enter the atmosphere of Spirit. There is but one Spirit.

3. SH 254:26

24 What is there to strip off error's disguise?

4. SH 343:14

Jesus strips all disguise from error, when his teachings are fully understood. By parable and argument he ex-

plains the impossibility of good producing evil; and he also scientifically demonstrates this great

fact, proving by what are wrongly called miracles, that sin, sickness, and death are beliefs — illusive errors — which he could and did destroy.

5. SH 454:11

That evil or matter has neither intelligence nor power, is the doctrine of absolute Christian Science, and this is the great truth which strips all disguise from error.

6. SH 186:28-29

Mortal mind is ignorant of self, or it could never be self-deceived.

7. SH 86:13-20

Mortals evolve images of thought. These may appear to the ignorant to be apparitions; but they are myste-

- rious only because it is unusual to see thoughts, though we can always feel their influence. Haunted houses, ghostly voices, unusual
- noises, and apparitions brought out in dark seances either involve feats by tricksters, or they are images and sounds evolved involuntarily by mortal mind.

587:1 **GHOST.** An illusion; a belief that mind is outlined and limited; a supposition that spirit is finite.

9. SH 353:13-14 (to 2nd.)

The age has not wholly outlived the sense of ghostly beliefs. It still holds them more or less.

10. SH 352:12-32

Would a mother say to her child, who is frightened at imaginary ghosts and sick in consequence of the fear: "I know that ghosts are real. They exist,

and are to be feared; but you must not be afraid of them"?

Children, like adults, *ought* to fear a reality which can harm them and which they do not understand, for at any moment they may become its helpless victims; but instead of increasing children's fears by declaring ghosts to be real, merciless, and powerful, thus watering the very roots of childish timidity, children should be assured that their fears are groundless, that ghosts

are not realities, but traditional beliefs, erroneous and man-made.

In short, children should be told not to believe in ghosts, because there are no such things. If belief in their reality is destroyed, terror of ghosts will depart and health be restored. The objects of alarm will then vanish into nothingness, no longer seeming worthy of fear or honor. To accomplish a good result, it is certainly not irrational to tell the truth about ghosts.

11. SH 371:5

21

Disquisitions on disease have a mental effect similar to that produced on children by telling ghost-stories in the dark. By those uninstructed in Christian Science, nothing is really understood of material

- existence. Mortals are believed to be here without their consent and to be removed as involuntarily, not knowing why nor when. As frightened children look everywhere
- for the imaginary ghost, so sick humanity sees danger in every direction, and looks for relief in all ways except the right one. Darkness induces fear. The adult, in bond-
- age to his beliefs, no more comprehends his real being than does the child; and the adult must be taken out of his darkness, before he can get rid of the illusive suffer-
- ings which throng the gloaming. The way in divine Science is the only way out of this condition.

Truth, through her eternal laws, unveils error.

13. SH 122:1-7

- The evidence of the physical senses often reverses the real Science of being, and so creates a reign of discord,—
- assigning seeming power to sin, sickness, and death; but the great facts of Life, rightly understood, defeat this triad of errors, contradict their false
- witnesses, and reveal the kingdom of heaven, the actual reign of harmony on earth.

14. SH 472:24-29 All

- 24 All reality is in God and His creation, harmonious and eternal. That which He creates is good, and He makes all that is made. Therefore
- the only reality of sin, sickness, or death is the awful fact that unrealities seem real to human, erring belief, until God strips off their disguise.

15. SH 186:17-19 (to .)

Evil is self-assertive. It says: "I am a real entity, overmastering good." This falsehood should strip evil of all pretensions.

16. SH 103:18, 25

- As named in Christian Science, animal magnetism or hypnotism is the specific term for error, or mortal mind. It is the false belief that mind is in matter, and
- is both evil and good; that evil is as real as good and more powerful. This belief has not one quality of Truth. It is either ignorant or malicious. The
- 24 malicious form of hypnotism ultimates in moral idiocy. The truths of immortal Mind sustain man, and they annihilate the fables of mortal mind, whose flimsy and gaudy
- 27 pretensions, like silly moths, singe their own wings and fall into dust.

17. SH 205:7-9

When will the error of believing that there is life in matter, and that sin, sickness, and death are creations of

9 God, be unmasked?

18. SH 570:30

Many are willing to open the eyes of the people to the power of good resident in divine Mind, but they are not so willing to point out the evil in human thought,

The mild forms of animal magnetism are disappearing, and its aggressive features are coming to the front.

present methods of animal magnetism that they ensure the age into indolence, and produce the very apathy on the subject which the criminal desires.

20. SH 92:21 (only), 25-26, 29

- Uncover error, and it turns the lie upon you. We should blush to call that real which is only a mistake. The mistake of thinking that error can be real,
- when it is merely the absence of truth, leads to belief in the superiority of error.

21. SH 6:23-27

Jesus uncovered and rebuked sin before he cast it

- out. Of a sick woman he said that Satan had bound her, and to Peter he said, "Thou art an offence unto me." He came teaching and
- showing men how to destroy sin, sickness, and death.

22. SH 447:24-27

To put down the claim of sin, you must detect it, remove the mask, point out the illusion, and thus get the victory over sin and so prove its unreality.

23. SH 453:18-20

27

You uncover sin, not in order to injure, but in order to bless the corporeal man; and a right motive has its reward.

24. SH 30:26-28

If we have triumphed sufficiently over the errors of material sense to allow Soul to hold the control, we shall loathe sin and rebuke it under every mask.
