1. Ps. 30:4

4 Sing unto the LORD, O ye saints of his, and give thanks at the remembrance of his holiness.

- 16 it came to pass, as we went to prayer, a certain damsel possessed with a spirit of divination met us, which brought her masters much gain by soothsaying:
- 17 The same followed Paul and us, and cried, saying, These men are the servants of the most high God, which shew unto us the way of salvation.

- 2 And I heard a voice from heaven, as the voice of many waters, and as the voice of a great thunder: and I heard the voice of harpers harping with their harps:
- And they sung as it were a new song before the throne, and before the four beasts, and the elders: and no man could learn that song but the hundred *and* forty *and* four thousand, which were redeemed from the earth.

15. Rev. 15:1-3

- 1 AND I saw another sign in heaven, great and marvellous, seven angels having the seven last plagues; for in them is filled up the wrath of God.

2. SH 199:32-4

When Homer sang of the Grecian gods, Olympus was 200:1 dark, but through his verse the gods became alive in a nation's belief. Pagan worship began with muscularity,

but the law of Sinai lifted thought into the song of David.

3. SH 135:1

The Psalmist sang: "What ailed thee, O thou sea, that thou fleddest? Thou Jordan,

- that thou wast driven back? Ye mountains, that ye skipped like rams, and ye little hills, like lambs? Tremble, thou earth, at the presence of the
- Lord, at the presence of the God of Jacob." The miracle introduces no disorder, but unfolds the primal order, establishing the Science of God's unchangeable law.

4. SH 190:21

The Hebrew bard, swayed by mortal thoughts, thus swept his lyre with saddening strains on human existence:

- 27 When hope rose higher in the human heart, he sang:

As for me, I will behold Thy face in righteousness: I shall be satisfied, when I awake, with Thy likeness.

For with Thee is the fountain of life; In Thy light shall we see light.

5. SH 213:16-29

Sound is a mental impression made on mortal belief. The ear does not really hear. Divine Science reveals sound as communicated through the senses of Soul—through spiritual understanding.

Mozart experienced more than he expressed. The
rapture of his grandest symphonies was never heard. He
was a musician beyond what the world knew.
This was even more strikingly true of Bee-

- 24 thoven, who was so long hopelessly deaf. Mental melodies and strains of sweetest music supersede conscious sound. Music is the rhythm of head and heart.
- 27 Mortal mind is the harp of many strings, discoursing either discord or harmony according as the hand, which sweeps over it, is human or divine.

6. SH 565:23

After the stars sang together and all was primeval harmony, the material lie made war upon the spiritual idea; but this only impelled the idea to rise to the zenith of demonstration, destroying sin, sickness, and death, and to be caught up unto God, — to be found in its divine Principle.

7. SH 304:16-4

Harmony is produced by its Principle, is controlled by it and abides with it. Divine Principle is the Life of man. Man's happiness is not, therefore, at the disposal of physical sense. Truth is not contaminated by error. Harmony in man is as beautiful as in music, and discord is unnatural, unreal.

- 305:1 the hands of ignorance, placed at the disposal of illusions, subjected to material sense which is discord. A discon-
- tented, discordant mortal is no more a *man* than discord is music.

8. SH 220:8-21

Instinct is better than misguided reason, as even nature declares. The violet lifts her blue eye to greet the early spring. The leaves clap their hands as nature's untired worshippers. The snowbird sings and soars

- amid the blasts; he has no catarrh from wet feet, and procures a summer residence with more ease than a nabob. The atmosphere of the earth, kinder than the at-
- 15 mosphere of mortal mind, leaves catarrh to the latter. Colds, coughs, and contagion are engendered solely by human theories.
- Mortal mind produces its own phenomena, and then charges them to something else, like a kitten glancing into the mirror at itself and thinking
- it sees another kitten.

9. SH 276:12

- The realization that all inharmony is unreal brings objects and thoughts into human view in their true light, and presents them as beautiful and immortal. Harmony
- in man is as real and immortal as in music. Discord is unreal and mortal.

10. SH 559:10-11, 12-19 2nd It

The inaudible voice of

Truth is, to the human mind, "as when a lion roareth." It

- arouses the "seven thunders" of evil, and stirs their latent forces to utter the full diapason of secret tones. Then is
- the power of Truth demonstrated, made manifest in the destruction of error. Then will a voice from harmony cry: "Go and take the little book. . . . Take it, and eat
- it up; and it shall make thy belly bitter, but it shall be in thy mouth sweet as honey."

11. SH viii:4

To develop the full might of this Science, the discords of corporeal sense

The reflex phenomena

must yield to the harmony of spiritual sense, even as the science of music corrects false tones and gives sweet concord to sound.

12. SH 255:1-6

255:1 Eternal Truth is changing the universe. As mortals drop off their mental swaddling-clothes, thought

- expands into expression. "Let there be light," is the perpetual demand of Truth and Love, changing chaos into order and discord into the
- 6 music of the spheres.

13. SH 568:24-30
