The term Christian Science was introduced by the author to designate the scientific system of divine

The revelation consists of two parts:

- 1. The discovery of this divine Science of Mind-
- 21 healing, through a spiritual sense of the Scriptures and through the teachings of the Comforter, as promised by the Master.
- 24 2. The proof, by present demonstration, that the socalled miracles of Jesus did not specially belong to a dispensation now ended, but that they illustrated an
- 27 ever-operative divine Principle.

3. SH 342:7-12

He that

decries this Science does it presumptuously,

- in the face of Bible history and in defiance of the direct command of Jesus, "Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel," to which command was added the promise
- that his students should cast out evils and heal the sick.

4. SH 566:1-9

- As the children of Israel were guided triumphantly through the Red Sea, the dark ebbing and flowing tides
- of human fear, as they were led through the wilderness, walking wearily through the great desert of human hopes, and anticipating the promised
- joy, so shall the spiritual idea guide all right desires in their passage from sense to Soul, from a material sense of existence to the spiritual, up to the glory prepared for
- 9 them who love God.

5. SH 69:13-16

Spiritually to understand that there is but one creator, God, unfolds all creation, confirms the ScripSpiritual

tures, brings the sweet assurance of no parting, no pain, and of man deathless and perfect and eternal.

6. SH 246:20-23

Except for the error of meas-

uring and limiting all that is good and beautiful, man would enjoy more than threescore years and ten and still maintain his vigor, freshness, and promise.

7. SH 230:1-8

230:1 If sickness is real, it belongs to immortality; if true, it is a part of Truth. Would you attempt with drugs,

- or without, to destroy a quality or condition of Truth?

 But if sickness and sin are illusions, the awakening from this mortal dream, or illusion, will bring us into health,
- 6 holiness, and immortality. This awakening is the forever coming of Christ, the advanced appearing of Truth, which casts out error and heals the sick.

8. SH xi:9

- The physical healing of Christian Science results now, as in Jesus' time, from the operation of divine Principle, before which sin and disease lose their real-
- ity in human consciousness and disappear as naturally and as necessarily as darkness gives place to light and sin to reformation. Now, as then, these mighty works
- are not supernatural, but supremely natural. They are the sign of Immanuel, or "God with us," a divine influence ever present in human consciousness and re-
- peating itself, coming now as was promised aforetime,

To preach deliverance to the captives [of sense], And recovering of sight to the blind,

21 To set at liberty them that are bruised.

9. SH 150:8

This coming, as was promised

- by the Master, is for its establishment as a permanent dispensation among men; but the mission of Christian Science now, as in the time of its earlier demonstration,
- is not primarily one of physical healing. Now, as then, signs and wonders are wrought in the metaphysical healing of physical disease; but these signs are only to demon-
- strate its divine origin, to attest the reality of the higher mission of the Christ-power to take away the sins of the world.

10. SH 569:14-16

Alas for those who

break faith with divine Science and fail to strangle the serpent of sin as well as of sickness!

11. SH 416:24

- The sick know nothing of the mental process by which they are depleted, and next to nothing of the metaphysical method by which they can be
- healed. If they ask about their disease, tell them only what is best for them to know. Assure them that they think too much about their ailments, and
- 30 have already heard too much on that subject. Turn their thoughts away from their bodies to higher objects. Teach them that their being is sustained by
- 417:1 Spirit, not by matter, and that they find health, peace, and harmony in God, divine Love.

12. SH 267:19

When examined in the light of divine Science, mortals present more than is detected upon the surface, since

- inverted thoughts and erroneous beliefs must be counterfeits of Truth. Thought is borrowed from a higher source than matter, and
- by reversal, errors serve as waymarks to the one Mind, in which all error disappears in celestial Truth. The robes of Spirit are "white and glistering," like the raiment
- of Christ. Even in this world, therefore, "let thy garments be always white." "Blessed is the man that endureth [overcometh] temptation: for when he is tried,
- 30 [proved faithful], he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him." (James i. 12.)

13. SH 328:20-28

Under-

- standing spiritual law and knowing that there is no material law, Jesus said: "These signs shall follow them that believe, . . . they shall take up serpents, and if they
- drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them. They shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover." It were well had Christendom believed and obeyed this
- sacred saying.

Jesus' promise is perpetual.

14. SH 373:1-5

- 373:1 If we are Christians on all moral questions, but are in darkness as to the physical exemption which Christian-
- ity includes, then we must have more faith in God on this subject and be more alive to

15. SH 497:24 1st And

Disease far more docile than iniquity

- And we solemnly promise to watch, and pray for that Mind to be in us which was also in Christ Jesus; to do unto others as we would have them do unto us; and
