His purpose in healing

was not alone to restore health, but to demonstrate his divine Principle. He was inspired by God, by

24 Truth and Love, in all that he said and did.

- 9 **ELIAS.** Prophecy; spiritual evidence opposed to material sense;
- "Elias truly shall first come and restore all things." (Matthew xvii. 11.)

death is an error that tends to frighten into death those who are ignorant of Life as God. Thousands of instances could be cited of health restored

by changing the patient's thoughts regarding death.

7. SH 124:25

Spirit is the life, substance, and continuity of all things. We tread on forces. Withdraw them, and creation must collapse. Human knowledge calls them forces of matter; but divine Science declares that they belong wholly to divine Mind, are inherent in this

30 Mind, and so restores them to their rightful home and classification.

8. SH 162:4, 16

Christian Science brings to the body the sunlight of Truth, which invigorates and purifies. Christian Science

- acts as an alterative, neutralizing error with Truth. It changes the secretions, expels humors, dissolves tumors, relaxes rigid muscles, restores
- carious bones to soundness. The effect of this Science is to stir the human mind to a change of base, on which it may yield to the harmony of the divine Mind.

- 24 healthy organizations have been established where disease was organic. Christian Science heals organic disease as surely as it heals what is called functional, for it requires
- only a fuller understanding of the divine Principle of Christian Science to demonstrate the higher rule.

- When you can waken yourself or others out of the belief that all must die, you can then exercise Jesus' spiritual power to reproduce the presence of those who have thought
- 24 they died, but not otherwise.

30 death.
