Heb 11:3, 6, 7 (to :), 8, 11, 17, 20, 21 (to :), 24 Moses, 27, 29 (to :), 30, 32-34 (to 3rd ,)

- 3 Through faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that things which are seen were not made of things which do appear.
- 6 But without faith *it is* impossible to please *him*; for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and *that* he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.
- 7 By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house;

- 8 By faith Abraham, when he was called to go out into a place which he should after receive for an inheritance, obeyed; and he went out, not knowing whither he went.
- 11 Through faith also Sara herself received strength to conceive seed, and was delivered of a child when she was past age, because she judged him faithful who had promised.
- 17 By faith Abraham, when he was tried, offered up Isaac; and he that had received the promises offered up his only begotten *son*,
- 20 By faith Isaac blessed Jacob and Esau concerning things to come.
- 21 By faith Jacob, when he was a-dying, blessed both the sons of Joseph;
- 24 Moses, when he was come to years, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter;
- 27 By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king: for he endured, as seeing him who is invisible.
- 29 By faith they passed through the Red sea as by dry *land*:
- 30 By faith the walls of Jericho fell down, after they were compassed about seven days.
- 32 And what shall I more say? for the time would fail me to tell of Gedeon, and of Barak, and of Samson, and of Jephthæ; of David also, and Samuel, and of the prophets:
- 33 Who through faith subdued kingdoms, wrought righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions,
- 34 Quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong,
