- 1. Zech. 8:17 let (to;)
- 17 let none of you imagine evil in your hearts against his neighbour;
- 2. Gen. 13:1 Abram, 2, 5-7 (to:), 8

Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures by Mary Baker Eddy

1. SH 234:12-16

We should love our enemies and help them on the basis of the Golden Rule; but avoid casting pearls before those who trample them and the fact, the peaks and help the transfer of the peaks and the second se

them under foot, thereby robbing both themselves and others.

2. SH 88:18-20

To love one's neighbor as one's self, is a divine idea; but this idea can never be seen, felt, nor understood through the physical senses.

3. SH 205:22-27

When we realize that there is one Mind, the divine law of loving our neighbor as ourselves is unfolded;

- whereas a belief in many ruling minds hinders man's normal drift towards the one Mind, one God, and leads human thought into opposite channels
- where selfishness reigns.

4. SH 41:10-13

The pampered hypocrite may have a flowery pathway here, but

he cannot forever break the Golden Rule and escape the penalty due.

5. SH 138:27

Our Master said to every follower: "Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature! . . .

Redemption from selfishness

Heal the sick! . . . Love thy neighbor as thyself!" It was this theology of Jesus which healed the sick and the sinning. It is his theology in this book and the spiritual meaning of this theology, which heals the sick and causes the wicked to "forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts." It was our Master's theology which the impious sought to destroy.

6. SH 467:3-13 The

- The first demand of this Science is, "Thou shalt have no other gods before me." This *me* is Spirit. Therefore the command means this: Thou shalt
- have no intelligence, no life, no substance, no truth, no love, but that which is spiritual. The second is like unto it, "Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself."
- 9 It should be thoroughly understood that all men have one Mind, one God and Father, one Life, Truth, and Love. Mankind will become perfect in proportion as this fact
- becomes apparent, war will cease and the true brother-hood of man will be established.

7. SH 248:3-5

Love never loses sight of loveliness. Its halo rests upon its object. One marvels that a friend can ever seem less than beautiful.

8. SH 9:5-24

The test of all prayer lies in the answer to these

- questions: Do we love our neighbor better because of this asking? Do we pursue the old selfishness, satisfied with having prayed for some-
- 9 thing better, though we give no evidence of the sincerity of our requests by living consistently with our prayer? If selfishness has given place to kindness,
- we shall regard our neighbor unselfishly, and bless them that curse us; but we shall never meet this great duty simply by asking that it may be done. There is
- a cross to be taken up before we can enjoy the fruition of our hope and faith.
- Dost thou "love the Lord thy God with all thy
- heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind"?
 This command includes much, even the surrender of all merely material sensation, affec-
- tion, and worship. This is the El Dorado of Christianity. It involves the Science of Life, and recognizes only the divine control of Spirit, in which Soul is our master,

and material sense and human will have no place.

9. SH 366:3-19

- In order to cure his patient, the metaphysician must first cast moral evils out of himself and thus attain the spiritual freedom which will en-
- able him to cast physical evils out of his patient; but heal he cannot, while his own spiritual barrenness debars him from giving drink to the thirsty
- 9 and hinders him from reaching his patient's thought, yea, while mental penury chills his faith and understanding.
- The physician who lacks sympathy for his fellowbeing is deficient in human affection, and we have the apostolic warrant for asking: "He that loveth
- not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen?" Not having this spiritual affection, the physician lacks faith in the divine
- Mind and has not that recognition of infinite Love which alone confers the healing power.

10. SH 440:15-16

Now what greater justification can any deed have, than that it is for the good of one's neighbor?

11. SH 560:10-19

Heaven represents harmony, and divine Science interprets the Principle of heavenly harmony. The great

- miracle, to human sense, is divine Love, and the grand necessity of existence is to gain the true idea of what constitutes the kingdom of
- heaven in man. This goal is never reached while we hate our neighbor or entertain a false estimate of anyone whom God has appointed to voice His Word. Again,
- without a correct sense of its highest visible idea, we can never understand the divine Principle.

12. SH 55:16-21

15 My

weary hope tries to realize that happy day, when man shall

- recognize the Science of Christ and love his neighbor as himself, when he shall realize God's omnipotence and the healing power of the divine Love in what it has done
- 21 and is doing for mankind.
