mently on the great fact which covers the whole ground, that God, Spirit, is all, and that there is none beside

18 Him. There is *no disease*.

6. SH 414:21-28

The Scripture declares, "The Lord He is God [good]; there is none else beside Him." Even so, harmony is universal, and discord is unreal. Christian Science de-

- clares that Mind is substance, also that matter neither feels, suffers, nor enjoys. Hold these points strongly in view. Keep in mind the verity of being, — that man is
- the image and likeness of God, in whom all being is painless and permanent.

7. SH 417:10-16

Maintain

the facts of Christian Science, — that Spirit is God, and

- therefore cannot be sick; that what is termed matter cannot be sick; that all causation is Mind, acting through spiritual law. Then hold your ground with
- 15 the unshaken understanding of Truth and Love, and you will win.

8. SH 426:29

Man is immortal, and

the body cannot die, because matter has no life to surrender. The human concepts named matter, death, disease, sickness, and sin are all that can be destroyed.

9. SH 446:5

- 9 A thorough perusal of the author's publications heals
- 6 sickness. If patients sometimes seem worse while read-

ing this book, the change may either arise from the alarm of the physician, or it may mark the crisis of the disease. Perseverance in the perusal of the book has generally completely healed such cases.
