1. SH 14:25-28

Entirely separate from the belief and dream of material living, is the Life divine, revealing spiritual understanding and the consciousness of man's dominion over the whole earth.

2. SH 250:6-11 (to 1st.)

- Mortal existence is a dream; mortal existence has no real entity, but saith "It is I." Spirit is the Ego which never dreams, but understands all things;
- which never errs, and is ever conscious; which never believes, but knows; which is never born and never dies.

3. SH 543:9-15

The five corporeal senses cannot take cognizance of Spirit. They cannot come into His presence, and must dwell in dream-

- land, until mortals arrive at the understanding that material life, with all its sin, sickness, and death, is an illusion, against which divine Science is engaged in a warfare
- of extermination.

4. SH 95:28-32

Lulled by stupefying illusions, the world is asleep in the cradle of infancy, dreaming away the hours.

Material sense does not unfold the facts of existence; but spiritual sense lifts human consciousness into eternal Truth.

5. SH 71:10

Close your eyes, and you may dream that you see a flower, — that you touch and smell it. Thus you learn

- that the flower is a product of the so-called mind, a formation of thought rather than of matter. Close your eyes again, and you may see land-
- scapes, men, and women. Thus you learn that these also are images, which mortal mind holds and evolves and which simulate mind, life, and intelligence. From
- dreams also you learn that neither mortal mind nor matter is the image or likeness of God, and that immortal Mind is not in matter.

6. SH 397:24-26

Mortals are no more material in their waking hours than when they act, walk, see, hear, enjoy, or suffer in dreams.

- man; but a mortal is not man, for man is immortal. A mortal may be weary or pained, enjoy or suffer, according to the dream he entertains in sleep.
- When that dream vanishes, the mortal finds himself experiencing none of these dream-sensations. To the observer, the body lies listless, undisturbed, and sensa-
- 21 tionless, and the mind seems to be absent.

Now I ask, Is there any more reality in the waking dream of mortal existence than in the sleeping dream?

There cannot be, since whatever appears to be a mortal man is a mortal dream.

9. SH 188:11

Mortal existence is a dream of pain and pleasure in

- matter, a dream of sin, sickness, and death; and it is like the dream we have in sleep, in which every one recognizes his condition to be wholly a state of
- mind. In both the waking and the sleeping dream, the dreamer thinks that his body is material and the suffering is in that body.

10. SH 249:21-30 God

21 God

never slumbers, and His likeness never dreams. Mortals are the Adam dreamers.

- Sleep and apathy are phases of the dream that life, substance, and intelligence are material. The mortal nightdream is sometimes nearer the fact of being than are the
- 27 thoughts of mortals when awake. The night-dream has less matter as its accompaniment. It throws off some material fetters. It falls short of the skies, but makes its
- mundane flights quite ethereal.

11. SH 530:26-29

The history of error is a dream-narrative. The dream

has no reality, no intelligence, no mind; therefore the dreamer and dream are one, for neither is true nor real.

12. SH 196:6-8

Better the suffering which awakens mortal mind from its fleshly dream, than the false pleasures which tend to perpetuate this dream.

When we are awake, we dream of the pains and pleasures of matter. Who will say, even though he

- does not understand Christian Science, that this dream rather than the dreamer may not be mortal man? Who can rationally say otherwise,
- when the dream leaves mortal man intact in body and thought, although the so-called dreamer is unconscious?
- For right reasoning there should be but one fact before the thought, namely, spiritual existence.

To prevent disease or to cure it, the power of Truth, of divine Spirit, must break the dream of the material

- senses. Mentally insist that harmony is the fact, and
- 24 that sickness is a temporal dream. Realize the presence of health and the fact of harmonious being, until the body corresponds with the normal conditions of health
- 27 and harmony.

must yield to reason and revelation. Then mortals
will behold the nothingness of sickness and sin, and
