- 2 And Hezekiah was glad of them, and shewed them the house of his precious things, the silver, and the gold, and the spices, and the precious ointment, and all the house of his armour, and all that was found in his treasures: there was nothing in his house, nor in all his dominion, that Hezekiah shewed them not.
- ³ ¶ Then came Isaiah the prophet unto king Hezekiah, and said unto him, What said these men? and from whence came they unto thee? And Hezekiah said, They are come from a far country unto me, *even* from Babylon.
- 4 Then said he, What have they seen in thine house? And Hezekiah answered, All that *is* in mine house have they seen: there is nothing among my treasures that I have not shewed them.

Sensual treasures are laid up "where moth and rust

- doth corrupt." Mortality is their doom. Sin breaks in upon them, and carries off their fleeting joys.
 The sensualist's affections are as imaginary,
- 9 whimsical, and unreal as his pleasures. Falsehood, envy, hypocrisy, malice, hate, revenge, and so forth, steal away the treasures of Truth.

6. SH 239:5-15

Take away wealth, fame, and social organizations,

- ⁶ which weigh not one jot in the balance of God, and we get clearer views of Principle. Break up cliques, level wealth with honesty, let worth
- 9 be judged according to wisdom, and we get better views of humanity.

The wicked man is not the ruler of his upright

- neighbor. Let it be understood that success in error is defeat in Truth. The watchword of Christian Science is Scriptural: "Let the wicked forsake his way, and the
- 15 unrighteous man his thoughts."

7. SH 57:15-24

- Beauty, wealth, or fame is incompetent to meet the demands of the affections, and should never weigh against the better claims of intellect, good-
- ness, and virtue. Happiness is spiritual, born of Truth and Love. It is unselfish; therefore it cannot exist alone, but requires all mankind to

share it.
 Human affection is not poured forth vainly, even though it meet no return. Love enriches the nature, en-

²⁴ larging, purifying, and elevating it.

8. SH 58:21-30

Home is the dearest spot on earth, and it should be the centre, though not the boundary, of the affections.

- 24 Said the peasant bride to her lover: "Two eat no more together than they eat separately." This is a hint that a wife ought not to court vulgar extravagance
- or stupid ease, because another supplies her wants. Wealth may obviate the necessity for toil or the chance for ill-nature in the marriage relation, but noth-
- ³⁰ ing can abolish the cares of marriage.

Job said: "I have heard of Thee by the hearing of the ear: but now mine eye seeth Thee." Mortals will echo Job's thought, when the supposed pain and

pleasure of matter cease to predominate. They

- 21 will then drop the false estimate of life and happiness, of joy and sorrow, and attain the bliss of loving unselfishly, working patiently, and conquering all that is unlike God.

Jesus bore our sins in his body. He knew the mortal errors which constitute the material body, and

- 27 could destroy those errors; but at the time when Jesus felt our infirmities, he had not conquered all the beliefs of the flesh or his sense of ma-
- 30 terial life, nor had he risen to his final demonstration of spiritual power.

11. SH 54:8-17

Who is ready to follow his teaching and example? All

- 9 must sooner or later plant themselves in Christ, the true idea of God. That he might liberally pour his dear-bought treasures into empty or sin-
- filled human storehouses, was the inspiration of Jesus' intense human sacrifice. In witness of his divine commission, he presented the proof that Life, Truth, and
- ¹⁵ Love heal the sick and the sinning, and triumph over death through Mind, not matter. This was the highest proof he could have offered of divine Love.

12. SH 47:16

A period was approaching which would reveal the infinite distance between Judas and his Master. Judas

- Iscariot knew this. He knew that the great goodness of that Master placed a gulf between Jesus and his betrayer, and this spiritual distance inflamed Judas' envy. The
- ²¹ greed for gold strengthened his ingratitude, and for a time quieted his remorse. He knew that the world generally loves a lie better than Truth; and so he plotted the be-
- 24 trayal of Jesus in order to raise himself in popular estimation. His dark plot fell to the ground, and the traitor fell with it.

13. SH 565:6, 13-22

- 6 *Revelation* xii. 5. And she brought forth a man child, who was to rule all nations with a rod of iron: and her child was caught up unto God, and to His throne.
- The impersonation of the spiritual idea had a brief history in the earthly life of our
- 15 Master; but "of his kingdom there shall be no end," for Christ, God's idea, will eventually rule all nations
