Scriptural Selection

1. Ps 26:1, 2, 8, 11 I will

- 1 JUDGE me, O LORD; for I have walked in mine integrity: I have trusted also in the LORD; *therefore* I shall not slide.

- 2 Examine me, O LORD, and prove me; try my reins and my heart.
- 8 LORD, I have loved the habitation of thy house, and the place where thine honour dwelleth.
- 11 I will walk in mine integrity: redeem me, and be merciful unto me.

2. John 10:23-28 Jesus (to ;), 29 (to ;), 30

- 23 Jesus walked in the temple in Solomon's porch.
- 24 Then came the Jews round about him, and said unto him, How long dost thou make us to doubt? If thou be the Christ, tell us plainly.
- 25 Jesus answered them, I told you, and ye believed not: the works that I do in my Father's name, they bear witness of me.
- 26 But ye believe not, because ye are not of my sheep, as I said unto you.
- 27 My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me:
- 28 And I give unto them eternal life;
- 29 My Father, which gave *them* me, is greater than all;
- 30 I and *my* Father are one.

3. Mark 11:15-18 and Jesus

- 15 and Jesus went into the temple, and began to cast out them that sold and bought in the temple, and overthrew the tables of the moneychangers, and the seats of them that sold doves;
- 16 And would not suffer that any man should carry *any* vessel through the temple.
- 17 And he taught, saying unto them, Is it not written, My house shall be called of all nations the house of prayer? but ye have made it a den of thieves.
- 18 And the scribes and chief priests heard *it*, and sought how they might destroy him: for they feared him, because all the people were astonished at his doctrine.

4. Eph 5:1, 2

- 1 BE ye therefore followers of God, as dear children;
- 2 And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling savour.

5. Eph 2:13 now, 14, 19

- 13 now in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ.
- 14 For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition *between us*;
- 19 Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellow-citizens

with the saints, and of the household of God;

6. I Pet. 2:21-24 (to :),25

- 21 For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps:
- 22 Who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth:
- 23 Who, when he was reviled, reviled not again; when he suffered, he threatened not; but committed *himself* to him that judgeth righteously:
- 24 Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness:
- 25 For ye were as sheep going astray; but are now returned unto the Shepherd and Bishop of your souls.
