When we realize that there is one Mind, the divine law of loving our neighbor as ourselves is unfolded;

- whereas a belief in many ruling minds hinders
 man's normal drift towards the one Mind, one
 God, and leads human thought into opposite channels
- 27 where selfishness reigns.

Selfishness tips the beam of human existence towards the side of error, not towards Truth. Denial of the one-

ness of Mind throws our weight into the scale, not ofSpirit, God, good, but of matter.

When we fully understand our relation to the Divine,

we can have no other Mind but His, — no other Love,
 wisdom, or Truth, no other sense of Life, and no con-

₃ sciousness of the existence of matter or error.

SH 480:14

Inharmony has no

Principle; its action is erroneous and presupposes man to be in matter. Inharmony would make matter the cause as well as the effect of intelligence, or Soul, thus

Redemption from selfishness 18 attempting to separate Mind from God.

SH 477:26

Man is the expression of Soul. The Indians caught

- some glimpses of the underlying reality, when
 they called a certain beautiful lake "the smile
 of the Great Spirit." Separated from man,
- who expresses Soul, Spirit would be a nonentity; man,divorced from Spirit, would lose his entity. But there is,
- ¹ there can be, no such division, for man is coexistent with God.

SH 306:13

If Life or Soul and its representative, man, unite for a period and then are separated as by a law of divorce to

- be brought together again at some uncertain future time and in a manner unknown, and this is the general religious opinion of mankind, we are left without a
- rational proof of immortality. But man cannot be separated for an instant from God, if man reflects God.
 Thus Science proves man's existence to be intact.

Man inseparable from Spirit

- Answer. The first demand of this Science is, "Thou shalt have no other gods before me." This *me* is Spirit.
 Therefore the command means this: Thou shalt
- have no intelligence, no life, no substance, no
 truth, no love, but that which is spiritual. The second
 is like unto it, "Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself."
- 9 It should be thoroughly understood that all men have one
 Mind, one God and Father, one Life, Truth, and Love.
 Mankind will become perfect in proportion as this fact
- becomes apparent, war will cease and the true brotherhood of man will be established. Having no other gods, turning to no other but the one perfect Mind to guide
- him, man is the likeness of God, pure and eternal, hav-ing that Mind which was also in Christ.
